

## Fix-A-Leak Instructions

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We have found that the following instructions have worked well, (often better), than the ones listed on the bottle. There is no guarantee that Fix-A-Leak will solve the problem, but with a small leak of around 1" per week, it's the easiest and cheapest thing to try first. Sometimes the leak stays fixed for months, years, or forever; there is just no way to predict. We'll keep our fingers crossed and hope for the best.

- 1. Turn heater temperature to about 60 degrees.
- 2. Remove filter(s).
- **3.** Turn jet pump(s) on high speed.
- 4. Locate filter canister that is dawing water at fatest rate.
- 5. Shake the bottle of Fix-A-Leak well.
- 6. Slowly pour entire contents into that canister. It's pretty thick, so take your time. (This may take up to 45 seconds).
- 7. With spa cover closed, run jet pump(s) for about 2 hours.
- 8. Your spa normally filters the water twice a day. When you think about it, run the jet pump(s) an additional 2-3 times per day for 7 days. (If your upper control panel is programmable, set to 4 cycles per day, at 180 minutes each).
- 9. Drain spa. Clean shell.
- **10.** Let the spa sit empty and "cure" for up to 7 more days.
- 11. Re-fill spa, re-install filter(s), and raise heat back to desired temperature. Use as you normally would.
